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



# Shaping Glass

How a chance meeting changed the direction of M. Night Shyamalan's stealth trilogy

**F**IRST THERE WAS *UNBREAKABLE*, THEN *SPLIT*, now we have *Glass*.

M. Night Shyamalan's stealth trilogy about superheroes and supervillains living among us sans capes and tights concludes this month with the finale we didn't know we were expecting until the (surprise, surprise) twist ending of 2016's *Split*.

That film about the deranged Kevin Wendell Crumb (James McAvoy) — a man with 24 distinct personalities and a penchant for kidnapping teen girls — concluded with a cameo from Bruce Willis as David Dunn, the superhuman good guy from 2000's *Unbreakable*, and a reference to Dunn's nemesis, Mr. Glass (Samuel L. Jackson).

Now all three — Dunn, Mr. Glass and Crumb — are locked in an institution under the supervision of skeptical psychiatrist Dr. Ellie Staple (Sarah Paulson). We don't imagine this will go well.

While discussing *Glass* at last year's Comic-Con, the director explained why, in a fascinating real-life twist, without a chance meeting at the same event

a few years earlier the series wouldn't have panned out as it did.

"I came here for *The Visit* and we went to one of these parties here," recalled Shyamalan. "I'd written *Split*, but I didn't know who in the world could play this part."

That's when McAvoy walked by. "I grab him and I go, 'Hey, I love your stuff.' And he's like, 'Hey, I love your stuff.'"

McAvoy had just filmed one of the *X-Men* movies so his head was shaved to play Professor X. "And I was like, 'This is the guy, and this is how he should look in the movie, we shouldn't do wigs, we shouldn't do makeup, he should just do it with expressions,'" remembered Shyamalan.

The filmmaker also revealed that McAvoy's character, now known as The Horde, was in the first draft of the *Unbreakable* script. "But it was too unwieldy, so I pulled him out." —MW



## THE LONG ROAD TO SERENITY



As Matthew McConaughey hits theatres in *Serenity*, a film noir about a fishing boat captain caught up in a dangerous scheme, we revisit our interview from February 2003 when his rom-com *How to Lose a Guy in 10 Days* was released. McConaughey was already coming out of his first self-imposed exile from Hollywood, eight years before his famous McConaissance, a two-year break that was followed by a rich period of dramatic pictures that included *Mud* and *Killer Joe*.

He'd taken a few months off and retreated to his Austin, Texas, home to give things a rethink.

"Sitting out in my backyard and garden finally gave me the time and clarity I had lost," he told us. "I began to look back at the library of work I'd done, and tried to understand exactly why I did everything I had. I basically re-customized myself, for lack of a better word. I thought, 'Maybe I can't tell you exactly what it is I do want and need or exactly what is right or true for me. But I can sure as hell put my finger on what I don't want, what I do disagree with or what goes against my grain.'"

The road to creative fulfilment isn't a straight one, and he'd go on to make more so-so movies, like 2005's *Sahara* and 2006's *Failure to Launch*, before finally giving up on rom-coms, apparently for good, and even winning his first Best Actor Oscar for *Dallas Buyers Club* in 2014.

**J**ASON JONES ISN'T EXACTLY A TEAM PLAYER IN director Adam Shankman's comedy *What Men Want*, about a sports agent named Ali Davis (Taraji P. Henson) who gains the ability to read men's thoughts. At first, Ali thinks it's a curse, but she soon realizes her new skill allows her to even the playing field with her macho boss and co-workers.

Jones, a Hamilton, Ontario, native who spent 10 years as a correspondent on TV's *The Daily Show*, plays a fellow agent at Ali's agency, and as he explains on the line from New York City, "You think he is on her side, but maybe he's not." Jones rarely acts in movies; he's busy starring in the fourth season of the TV comedy *The Detour*, which he co-writes and produces with wife and late-night TV star Samantha Bee. But going for big-screen laughs opposite Henson was a chance he couldn't pass up.



## WHO'S FINN AGAIN?

Phil Lord gave the crowd this teaser: **"We wanted...to tell the story about combining two different imaginations, and it seems like maybe Finn's sister is involved in this one, and that is like going to a completely different universe."** Finn was the little boy in the live-action ending of *The LEGO Movie* who, we discovered, had orchestrated the story we'd just watched by breaking the rules and playing with his dad's (Will Ferrell) meticulously constructed LEGO world in their basement.

## LIFE IMITATES BRICKS


When asked how much of himself there is in Emmet Brickowski, Chris Pratt didn't refer to personality traits, but life experiences: **"Oh my gosh, so much more than just my voice. If you look at the timeline of when we shot *The LEGO Movie*, when I first was given the role I was playing [regular guy] Andy on *Parks and Recreation* [pictured left] and Emmet starts the film as this sort of painfully ordinary fellow who's given this extraordinary opportunity. And by the time we'd finished our recording sessions I was Star-Lord and so that arc, it was one of those moments, I'm sure you have these, where you think, 'Oh my life is a computer simulation and I'm living in the Matrix.'"**

## EXPANDING UNIVERSE

Animation director Trisha Gum said to expect the unexpected as our heroes head into space: **"What's been fun about designing this new world is we blast off out of the basement into the Sistar system, as we're calling it, and it's just been rich with ideas and new characters...talking ice cream cones and bananas."**

## PASSING THROUGH

When Elizabeth Banks thinks of childhood experiences with LEGO, it's not playing that comes to mind: **"My LEGO story is my dog ate a LEGO when I was little and then we had to take him to the hospital and there was a whole going through his poo situation."**



## LEGO WORLDS COLLIDE

Rex Dangervest, a space-travelling, dinosaur-wrangling archeologist who is also voiced by Pratt in the new film, is a riff on other Pratt characters — *Guardians of the Galaxy's* Star-Lord and *Jurassic World's* Owen Grady, both of whom have their own LEGO mini-figs, by the way.

One more inside joke. In the film's trailer we see Emmet piloting an aircraft while telling his sidekick, a shrub, "Hold onto your fronds, Planty," a reference to *Guardians of the Galaxy's* tree-creature Groot, who's seen top right with Pratt's Star-Lord.





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# Battle Plan

It took two great filmmakers to bring ***Alita: Battle Angel*** to life. Here director **Robert Rodriguez** explains why he was more than happy to yield to his friend James Cameron's vision in creating this groundbreaking sci-fi

## ver the past 25 years director Robert Rodriguez has often visited his friend James Cameron on sets.

The filmmakers showed each other early material, even planned to direct something together. One day, Rodriguez asked Cameron about the status of *Battle Angel Alita*, Cameron's passion project based on Yukito Kishiro's manga series.

Cameron finally had to admit that after working on the project for well over a decade he didn't have time to finish it between his four *Avatar* sequels. He showed Rodriguez the work he'd already done and even gave him the script in which Alita, an amnesiac girl cyborg, is discovered in a trash heap by a doctor looking for parts.

Which is why this February we get *Alita: Battle Angel*, a live action-CGI hybrid from director Robert Rodriguez, co-written and produced by James Cameron. In a motion-capture performance, Rosa Salazar plays Alita, who wakes up in a dangerous world where she has to fight to survive. Christoph Waltz is Dr. Dyson Ido, the doctor who finds her, and Keanu Reeves is Alita's pal, Hugo.

We spoke with bad-boy Austin filmmaker Rodriguez in Los Angeles, where he explained what it means to take on a massive James Cameron movie.

**You got a 180-page script and 600 pages of notes from James Cameron. How did you condense that into a two-hour movie?**

Only 600 pages of notes? There were a thousand!

**What could possibly be in there?**

I know. That was what I was thinking. What could possibly be in there? But it was really amazing to see how somebody builds a franchise. How he builds it. He doesn't just write one story; he already has to figure out what would be the story after, what would be the story before....

And it's not like notes like we take; it's like a book. There's a whole set of pages on, like, one chapter is just on the Christoph character, on Alita, on the cyborg, on what it means to be a cyborg, on the city, on the upper city, on the first movie, on the second movie, on the possible third movie.... Jim is an engineer by trade, and that's just how he thinks. So it's not like a normal — a creative person is sometimes not very organized, a creative person can usually be very not methodical. He's the opposite, he's both. And that's why he is so powerful.

**How did you approach this mammoth project?**

I've known Jim for 25 years, I've studied his work, we've been friends a long time, [so] I looked at the script and I thought, I need to cut out all the things that are not that important to the story and then leave all the things that are important to Jim. I know him enough that it's like, he's not going to care so much about this, he is going to care about the father-daughter relationship, he is going to care about the Hugo relationship. None of the movie works if the story about the characters doesn't work.

**Was he on the set or did he let you do your thing?**

He really wanted me to make it my own movie, but I made him understand that I really wanted to make a Jim Cameron film because I didn't really want to take *Alita* and turn it into a Robert Rodriguez movie. I wanted to honour the style that he wrote it in, which is very different than what I do. I do stuff, usually because of both my taste, I started as a cartoonist, and also because I usually have much less money to work with, I have to be more whimsical. My stuff is usually science-fiction, not science fact, because I can't afford fact. So if someone picks up a guitar case and fires a missile from it, that's enough for me. I don't have to know that it can really work or not. Jim, that doesn't fly with Jim. That has to be able to work.

### IN PERSON

**How close is the film to Yukito Kishiro's manga?**

The manga is many, many volumes. So Jim read all the manga, for instance he liked one of the villains and the father-daughter relationship of the first book, he liked the boy that she meets in the second book, he liked Motorball from the fourth book. And he figured out a way to put all that stuff together and add new twists to the story and levels of meaning that were very Jim Cameron.

**You're a filmmaker who loves doing everything himself — filming, editing, writing, the soundtrack, sometimes even the catering. Isn't it weird to do it Cameron-style?**

It is. It's very weird.... I liked doing all those other jobs. But this one, it wasn't difficult to make the leap at all 'cause you're surrounded by fantastic people. The problem is when you hire people in those jobs and you're better than them you'd rather do the job yourself. Well, here I was able to use a lot of Jim's guys and people that he's worked with that are just super-fantastic in photography and editing, and all the different positions.... I feel like an audience member a lot of times 'cause I've seen some of these images for the first time as the effects guys do them and go like, 'Wow! When did we shoot that? That's amazing! It didn't look like that when we shot it [laughs]!'

**You're probably the director who has worked with the largest budget range in Hollywood — lowest at \$7,000 (U.S.) for 1992's *El Mariachi* and now \$200-million for *Alita*. What did you learn and what's the budget of your next film?**

I've already made my next film. I'm just finishing it right now. I'm going to enter it into Sundance. It's less than \$7,000. Feature film.

**What? Are you serious?**

It was supposed to be \$7,000 but it came in under. It was the 25th anniversary of *El Mariachi* so I made a new film with my kids to celebrate it, and with no crew, just my son on boom...shot in 14 days in Austin. And we had a documentary crew film it to show how to make a movie, write it, shoot it, direct it, edit, cut it, score it yourself, with no money. It's going to be awesome.... Creativity is very malleable you know, you can do it on a very small scale and make something that looks big, or you can do it on a big scale and make something that looks huge. It's fun! 🎬



**SPOILER ALERT — THE MARVEL** Cinematic Universe is on life support (not the franchise, which is doing great, but the universe itself). The end of *Avengers: Infinity War* was a cinematic gut punch as we witnessed many of our beloved superheroes, including Star-Lord, Black Panther, Spider-Man and Groot, disintegrate before our eyes when baddie Thanos enacted his plan to wipe out half of all life in the universe.

But there was a glimmer of hope when Nick Fury (before his demise) sent out a mysterious signal for

help. We now know that signal was meant for Captain Marvel, who has remained hidden in the superhero realm. But before she can join the fight against Thanos we need to spend some time getting to know her.

Chiwetel Ejiofor voices Scar, Beyoncé is Nala, Simba's love interest, Billy Eichner and Seth Rogen are the comic meerkats Timon and Pumbaa, and James Earl Jones voices Simba's father Mufasa, just as he did in the original film.

(though the film was shot in Southern Ontario). Set in the 1980s the film was part horror, part homage to childhood friendships and a shout-out to the decade. The sequel is set 27 years later and finds the adult Bill (James McAvoy), Bev (Jessica Chastain) and Richie (Bill Hader) returning to their hometown of Derry to join with the rest of the grown-up Losers' Club to finally put an end to Pennywise.



# ONE FINAL HICCUP?

As the popular *How to Train Your Dragon* trilogy comes to an end with *The Hidden World*, actor **Jay Baruchel** reflects on voicing Hiccup the Viking, an unlikely role that's been the cornerstone of his career for nearly a decade, and looks ahead to the next chapter, which involves doubling down on the Canadian film industry

**“HOLY. OH MY GOSH. WELL, LET ME THINK.”** Jay Baruchel is doing the math, trying to figure out how many times he's voiced Hiccup, the Viking hero of the *How to Train Your Dragon* franchise, over the past decade.

“Every movie I probably do about half a dozen to a dozen recording sessions, and then for the TV show it's once an episode, so 12 times three, 24 plus 10, so 36, yeah, it's gotta be...”

He trails off.

“We gotta be in the, like, between a hundred and 200 range. Probably even more than that.”

The Ottawa-born, Montreal-raised, surprisingly proud Torontonian (more on that later) is looking back on one of the most unexpected roles of his career — voicing Hiccup, the young Viking who turns from dragon hunter to dragon friend after injuring a Night Fury dragon named Toothless.

He's sitting in his room at Winnipeg's Fort Garry hotel having just arrived in the Peg on a promotional tour for *Born Into It: A Fan's Life*, his memoir about being a sports fanatic. It's no coincidence that Baruchel's first two big-screen writing credits came with the *Goon* hockey films. The sequel, *Goon: Last of the Enforcers*, also marked his feature-film directing debut.

Outside, the city is covered with the season's first snowfall and, as Baruchel says in his adorably nasal voice, “It's cold as f---.” →

→ **CONSIDERING HOW MANY DRAGON MOVIES AND** shows he's done, it's a good thing Baruchel, now 36, can record the majority of Hiccup's voice work from anywhere in the world. Though Hiccup lives on the Viking island of Berk, most of his lines for this third movie were performed in a Toronto studio at King and Spadina with Baruchel's director, fellow Canadian Dean DeBlois, on Skype.

"I open the door and I go up an elevator and nobody out there knows I'm in the process of recording words for one of the most anticipated movies ever," Baruchel says. The first two films alone have earned more than a billion dollars worldwide.

The franchise that began with 2010's *How to Train Your Dragon*, continued with 2014's *How to Train Your Dragon 2* and concludes with this February's *How to Train Your Dragon: The Hidden World* has also produced two TV series, a handful of short films and a videogame — most of which not only featured Baruchel's voice but the voices of his famous co-stars like Gerard Butler as his dad Stoick the Vast (who dies in the second film, leaving Hiccup in charge of Berk) and America Ferrera as Hiccup's ladyfriend, Astrid.

Although Baruchel can't guarantee this will be the final film, he does say, "It certainly feels like there's a finality to it because the TV show is done as well, and that this is part three of what was always going to be a three-parter if people liked them."

As the third film begins life is nearly perfect on Berk. Hiccup's in charge, and even Toothless finds love with a female dragon of the same species. But when the villainous Grimmel the Grisly (F. Murray Abraham) threatens to capture all of Berk's dragons and destroy the idyllic Viking-dragon lifestyle, Hiccup and Toothless need to find the legendary hidden dragon home world.

"They wear their hearts on their sleeves these films, and that means us never shying away from delving into emotional stuff. We often go sadder than *Bambi*," says Baruchel. "You know, I get my leg taken off in the first one and my dad dies in the second.... But it's not sad for the sake of sad, right? The movies are incredibly emotional without being the slightest bit manipulative."

**IT'S ALMOST CLICHÉ TO SAY BARUCHEL IS A PROUD** Canadian. The man who has a maple leaf tattooed over his heart has always refused to move to New York or L.A., first buying a house in his beloved Notre-Dame-de-Grâce neighbourhood of Montreal and then, a few years ago, moving to Toronto's Beach area. "I love it there," he says. "Toronto's a really good town and I had, you know, really not spent enough time there to judge it fairly."

He made the unthinkable move when the politics and brutal cold of Montreal became too much for him. Or as he puts it, "I had a mini epiphany that I didn't want to deal with the stuff in Montreal that I didn't like anymore."

He's still a Habs fan.

Baruchel lives with his fiancée, model Rebecca-Jo Dunham, their cat Tulip and two Papillon puppies, Bean and Teddy. "Like Mr. Bean and teddy bear," he explains. "They're brothers from the same litter."

When asked whether there's any crossover between training a dragon and training a Papillon, he says, "I don't seem to remember as many Toothless pooping all over the place scenes as I have experienced with the Papillons at our house."

Apparently, Hiccup has some Canadian blood in him too. While taking part in a panel discussion at last year's Toronto International Film Festival, Baruchel revealed, "When I first got this job I was like, I'm gonna make Hiccup sound as hoser as I possibly can without getting in trouble."

Asked to expand on that, he says, "Everything from terminology, vocabulary, intonation and just paying less attention to trying to sound American. There's always these telltale words that give away Canadians working on American stuff... 'Tomorrow' is one of them, 'sorry' is another one."

And there's the fact that Hiccup often calls Toothless "Bud."

"There are precious few more Canadian terms of endearment than Bud," says Baruchel. "That's something very kind of ours."

Even one thing nitpickers may see as a flub, the fact that Hiccup sounds Canadian while his dad Stoick has Butler's Scottish accent, is something Baruchel claims is by design.

"In Canada, I know my experience, and a lot of people's experience, was a lot of teachers or friends' parents were from Scotland. There's just a big connection between the two countries and I know that Dean, our writer-director who grew up in Aylmer, Quebec, he said the whole reason why he gave the grown-ups that very distinct accent and had us all talk the way that we talk was

that was his recollection of growing up on his block, all the kids were Canadian like him, but all the parents were from elsewhere."

**IF YOU'RE WORRIED ABOUT BARUCHEL'S CAREER NOW THAT the *Dragon* trilogy is done, don't be. He's right where he wants to be, directing his first horror film.**

*Random Acts of Violence* is based on the graphic novel by Jimmy Palmiotti and Justin Gray and stars Jesse Williams as comic book writer Todd, Jordana Brewster as Todd's girlfriend Kathy and Baruchel as their friend Ezra, all of whom are on a road trip to New York Comic-Con that gets bloody.

It was shot in Toronto this past summer and should be out sometime in the next year.

"God help me, I want to work in Canadian film and television for the rest of my life," says Baruchel, "and the vast majority of my ideas are in English and so few better places to be if that's the case than Toronto."


