

**“The Cineplex WorldGaming Canadian Championships featuring Uncharted 4” (the “Tournament”) Official Rules and Regulations (Rules Amended July 19, 2016. Revisions to the Rules are noted by a blue font colour)**

**PLEASE REVIEW SECTION 3 BELOW TO DETERMINE YOUR ELIGIBILITY BEFORE ENTERING THE TOURNAMENT. UNLESS SPECIFICALLY PROVIDED FOR BELOW, IF ANY ENTRANT IS FOUND TO BE INELIGIBLE OR IS DISQUALIFIED AT ANY STAGE OF THE TOURNAMENT, HIS/HER TEAM WILL BE DISQUALIFIED AND WILL NOT MOVE FORWARD TO THE NEXT ROUND OF THE TOURNAMENT AND IF APPLICABLE, ALL TEAM MEMBERS WILL BE REQUIRED TO RETURN ANY PRIZES THAT MAY BE AWARDED.**

NO PURCHASE OR PAYMENT NECESSARY TO ENTER THE TOURNAMENT OR WIN. A PURCHASE OR PAYMENT WILL NOT INCREASE YOUR CHANCES OF WINNING. NOTWITHSTANDING THE FOREGOING, ALL ENTRANTS MUST HAVE A PLAYSTATION® PLUS ACCOUNT TO PARTICIPATE AND THERE IS A COST ASSOCIATED WITH MAINTAINING SUCH AN ACCOUNT.

**1. TOURNAMENT DATE**

- By entering and participating in the Tournament, each Entrant, as defined below, unconditionally accepts and agrees to comply with and abide by these Official Rules and Regulations (the "Tournament Rules") and the decisions of the Administrator, which shall be final and binding in all respects.
- Dates and times are subject to change. In the event that there is a change to the date/time of an event, Administrator will use reasonable efforts to notify Regional Qualifiers (as defined below) and Championship Qualifiers (as defined below) at least 72 hours prior to the event date.
- Any Entrant with a disability that requires accommodation to play at the Regional Event and/or Canadian Championship must contact the Administrator at [hi@worldgaming.com](mailto:hi@worldgaming.com) with “Canadian Championships – Accommodation Request” in the subject line before the end of the Online Qualifiers. Administrator will work with you to arrange for a suitable accommodation.

**2. ADMINISTRATOR**

- 2480625 Limited Partnership, 208 Adelaide Street West, Suite 200, Toronto, Ontario, M5H 1W7, is solely responsible for conducting and administering the Tournament (“Administrator”).

### **3. ELIGIBILITY**

- In order to participate eligible individuals (each an “Entrant”, collectively, “Entrants”) must be a member of a team of five (5) Entrants (a “Team”, or collectively “Teams”), as either the “Team Captain” or “Team Participant”, (each a “Team Member” or collectively, Team Members”). Each Entrant is only permitted to be a member of one Team. In the event that it is determined that an Entrant has joined more than one Team, that Entrant will be disqualified from all Teams joined and will not be able to continue in the Tournament. However, the remaining Team Members of the affected Teams will be permitted to continue.
- The Tournament is open to legal Canadian Residents, who reside in Canada during the duration of the Tournament schedule. In order to be a Team Captain, Entrants must be eighteen (18) years of age or older prior to the start of the Tournament. All other Team Participants must be at least sixteen (16) years of age or older prior to the start of the Tournament. Anyone under the age of majority in his/her province of residence (a “Minor”) must have a parent’s or legal guardian’s consent to participate. If it is determined that an Entrant is under the age of 18 (for Team Captain) or 16 (for Team Participant), the entire Team will be disqualified and will not be permitted to continue in the Tournament.
- All Team Captains must have a WorldGaming account and agree to the terms and conditions found at <http://worldgaming.com/terms-and-conditions>. There are no fees or service charges to create or maintain an account. The WorldGaming account creation form is age-gated to prevent anyone under the age of 18 from creating an account. If an Entrant attempts to bypass the age gate by entering a false date of birth that Entrant, and his/her Team will be disqualified.
- Each Team Member must have: a PlayStation® 4 system; a PS4™ copy of Uncharted 4: A Thief’s End (the “Game”); and an active PlayStation® Plus paid membership in order to enter the Tournament. There is a cost associated with maintaining a PlayStation® Plus account. Entrants should note that the Game will be played on a PlayStation® 4 during the Regional Event and Canadian Championship.
- Employees, officers and directors of the Administrator, Cineplex Entertainment LP (“Cineplex”), Intertaintech Inc., WG Limited (Intertaintech Inc. and WG Limited are collectively referred to as “WorldGaming”) and any Tournament sponsors including but not limited to Sony Computer Entertainment Canada Inc. (“SCEC”) (collectively referred to as “Tournament Sponsors”) and their respective parents, affiliated and subsidiary entities and the immediate family (spouse, parent, sibling, child) or members of their same households (whether related or not) of such employees, officers or directors are not eligible to participate in the Tournament.
- As set out in Section 10 below, all Entrants that qualify for the Regional Event and Canadian Championship will be required to sign a declaration and release confirming his or her understanding of, compliance with, and acceptance of the Tournament Rules with a standard release of all liability (the “Declaration”) before being permitted to participate. If the Entrant is a Minor, his/her parent/legal guardian must sign the Declaration on their behalf before being allowed to participate. If the parent or legal guardian does not consent to signing the Declaration, the Entrant will not be permitted to participate. In addition, any Entrant under the age of 18 that qualifies for the Canadian Championship must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian or his/her parent or legal guardian must designate an adult to accompany him/her, at their sole cost and expense. For greater clarity, the travel allowance set out below is only provided to the Entrant, not his/her parent or legal guardian. If the parent or legal guardian does not consent, the Entrant will not be entitled to the travel allowance and will not be permitted to participate in the Canadian Championship; however the remainder of the Team will still be allowed to participate.
- The Administrator shall have the right at any time to require proof, to its sole satisfaction, of identity, date of birth and/or residency to show eligibility to participate in the Tournament and to deny any Entrant or Team from playing or from being awarded any prize in the event that it is determined that one or more of the Entrants does not meet the eligibility criteria herein.
- The Tournament is subject to all applicable Canadian federal, provincial and local laws and regulations and is VOID WHERE PROHIBITED BY LAW.

### **4. HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN THE TOURNAMENT**

Online Qualifiers:

- How to Enter:

- A Team may participate in the Online Qualifiers by designating a Team Captain, and having said Team Captain go to [www.worldgaming.com](http://www.worldgaming.com) (the “Website”), log into their WorldGaming account or create a WorldGaming account, and enter into any of the location-specific Cineplex WorldGaming Canadian Championships featuring Uncharted 4 branded bracket competitions (“online tournament”, or collectively “online tournaments”). These will appear on the Website as “Canadian Championships – *theatre location*”. The Team Captain must then provide a Team Name and the PlayStation IDs (“PSN IDs”) for the remaining Team Members upon registration. Only Entrants whose PSN IDs match those registered by the Team Captain are eligible to play in the Tournament. Any Team playing at any stage of the Tournament, with a Team Member whose PSN ID does not match any of those registered by the Team Captain, will be disqualified and will not be eligible to continue in the Tournament, or if applicable, receive a prize. Each Entrant permits the Administrator to verify that his/her name is registered to the PSN ID used to enter the Tournament. In the event Administrator is unable to conclusively verify that the name of an Entrant matches the PSN ID used to enter the Tournament, that Entrant will be disqualified.
- Each Team is only permitted to participate in one online tournament per day during the Online Qualifiers.
- The theatre location identified on the Website corresponds to the location of the Regional Event the Team will be required to attend if they are the winner of any of the online tournaments during the Online Qualifiers. For example, a Team entering into a “Canadian Championships – Silvercity London” online tournament will only be eligible to qualify for the Silvercity London Regional Event. There are no exceptions. While Teams are permitted to enter any of the location-specific tournaments during the Online Qualifiers, the Team, if deemed a winner of an online tournament, will be required to attend the location of the Regional Event for the online tournament selected at their sole cost and expense. In the event that any Entrant has entered more than one tournament using the same or different email addresses, PSN IDs or WorldGaming accounts, that Entrant will be disqualified at Administrator’s sole discretion and will be removed from all further online tournaments during the Online Qualifiers by the Administrator.
- Pre-registration: Teams may pre-register for the Online Qualifiers based on the schedule below:

- How to Play:

- Each online tournament entered into has a pre-determined start time which can be found by viewing the tournament under the ‘My Tournaments’ tab of a Team Captain’s personal WorldGaming account.
- Matches for these tournaments are automatically generated on the Website at the start time under the ‘My Challenges’ tab of a Team Captain’s personal WorldGaming account. The Team Captain must check-in to each of their matches on the Website prior to the pre-determined start time. Teams must then complete the match using their Game, with the Team Captain reporting the results on the Website afterwards under the ‘My Challenges’ tab.
- The Team Captain whose Team Name is listed on top of the bracket, when viewed through the ‘My Tournaments’ tab, must host the Game.
- Private Match Game Mode, Maps, and Settings for all tournament Games during the Online Qualifiers:

  - Score Limit: 40

- Wave Spawning: On
- Respawn Time: 10 seconds
- Downed State: On
- Player Health: 100%
- Boosters: On
  
- Settings above marked with "\*" must be changed from their default selection in the in-game GAME SETTINGS menu.
- The Team Captain of the Team that appears on top in the bracket, when viewed on the Website, is responsible for creating and hosting the Private Match in the Game, inviting all Team Members, as well as the opposing Team Captain. The opposing Team Captain is responsible for inviting all their Team Members. All Team Members of the hosting Team must designate themselves as members of the BLUE team, and all opposing Team Members must designate themselves as members of the RED team.
- Format and settings are subject to change at the discretion of the Administrator. Additional details will be provided on the Website for each individual bracket competition.
- How to Win:
  - The Online Qualifiers will consist of six (6) online tournaments to be held on:
    - Ontario
      - Thursday June 23
      - Saturday June 25
      - Friday July 1
      - Sunday July 3
      - Thursday July 7
      - Saturday July 9
    - Rest of Canada
      - Friday June 24
      - Sunday June 26
      - Thursday June 30
      - Saturday July 2
      - Friday July 8
      - Sunday July 10

These will be free-to-enter single-elimination bracket competitions open to all Teams, with Team seeding generated sequentially based on time of entry. Teams will only be playing against other Teams that have registered for the same location-specific Cineplex WorldGaming Canadian Championships featuring Uncharted 4 branded tournaments. All Online Qualifier tournaments will begin at the designated start time regardless of the number of Teams. If a tournament does not fill to maximum capacity by the designated start time it will still play out in full and all Teams up to that point will be able to compete. Any Team without an opponent in a tournament round will receive a "bye" to the next round, at the discretion of the Administrator.

- The winning Team of the first four (4) online tournaments for each location, and the top two (2) Teams of the final two (2) tournaments, will qualify for the corresponding Regional Event, for a total of eight (8) Regional Qualifying Teams for each Regional Event location.
- Once a Team wins a tournament they will be deemed a "Regional Qualifying Team" and will no longer be able to participate in the remainder of the Online Qualifiers.
- In the event that a Regional Qualifying Team is unable to attend the Regional Event or is disqualified or found to be ineligible by the Administrator a replacement Team will be determined, at the discretion of the Administrator, by selecting the Team from the corresponding location-specific tournament that placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the final online tournament of the Online Qualifiers. Additional vacancies will be filled by selecting the Team that placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in each of the remaining online tournaments, beginning with the 7<sup>th</sup>, then the 6<sup>th</sup>, then the 5<sup>th</sup>, etc.

#### Regional Events:

- How to Play:
  - Each Regional Event will consist of a one-day single-elimination bracket competition held on July 24, 2016 at Cineplex theatres as described below in Section 5. The start time for each event is approximately 3:00pm local time. The exact start time will be communicated to the Team Captain of each Regional Qualifying Team by email on or before July 20, 2016. Each Team Captain is responsible for communicating dates, times, and changes to their Team.
  - All Team Members of each Regional Qualifying Team must be willing and available to participate in the Regional Event on the date and time and at a location as determined by the Administrator or they may forfeit their right to participate in said event. No player substitutions are permitted. If one or more Team Members are not available to participate at the Regional Event, the Team may still choose to play with only their available Team Members, provided that the Team Captain is available to participate. In the event that the Team Captain is not able to participate, the Team may be disqualified, at the sole discretion of the Administrator. However, if the Team qualifies for the Canadian Championship, Team Members that did not participate in the Regional Event will not be permitted to participate and will not receive the travel allowance set out in Section 6 below, and/or a portion of the Prize.
  - Private Match Game Mode, Maps, and Settings for all tournament Games during the Regional Events:

    - Maps: Round 1: Game 1: Auction House; Game 2: Rooftops; Game 3 (if necessary): Scotland | Round 2: Game 1: Madagascar City; Game 2: Island; Game 3 (if necessary): Pirate Colony | Round 3: Game 1: Auction House; Game 2: Remnants; Game 3 (if necessary): River
    - Time Limit: 7:00 Minutes\*
    - Score Limit: 40
    - Wave Spawning: On
    - Respawn Time: 6 seconds
    - Downed State: On
    - Player Health: 100%
    - Boosters: On
  - General tournament format and event rules to ensure a fair competition will be provided to each Regional Qualifying Teams at the Regional Event. Format and settings are subject to change at the discretion of the Administrator.
  - All Entrants may choose to bring their own PS4 controller. See Section 8 for additional details and restrictions regarding player equipment.
  - Quebec Entrants ONLY: Entrants from Quebec will be permitted to play the Game in English or French. Unless the Entrant provides his/her language preference at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the start of the Regional Event, he/she will be required to play the Game in English.
  - Team seeding for each Regional Event will be random.

#### Online Canadian Championship Qualifying Tournament

Each Team that wins their Regional Event (24 Regional Event winners in total) will be required to play in an Online Canadian Championship Qualifying Tournament to determine the top eight (8) teams that qualify for the Canadian Championship (each a "Championship Qualifying Teams"). The Online Canadian Championship Qualifying Tournament will be a single-elimination tournament held on the Website on August 6, 2016 made up of the twenty-four (24) winning Teams from the Regional Events. All Teams will be ranked against each other based on their average number of points per Game during the Regional Event and will be seeded 1st through 24th based on this ranking. The top 8 ranked Teams will receive a bye to the second Round. In the event that two or more Teams have the same number of points per Game during the Regional Event, the Team with the most points in a single Game will be considered the higher-ranked Regional Qualifying Team. To qualify for the Canadian Championship, a Team must place in the top eight (8) of the Online Canadian Championship Qualifying Tournament.

In the event that a Championship Qualifying Team is unable to attend the Canadian Championship or is disqualified or found to be ineligible by the Administrator a replacement will be determined, at the discretion of the Administrator, by selecting the Team that finished in 9<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup> place in the Online Canadian Championship Qualifying Tournament and had the highest average number of points per Game during the Regional Events. In the event that two or more Teams have the same number of points per Game during the Regional Events, the Team with the most points in a single Game will be considered the higher-ranked Team.

#### Canadian Championship:

- The Canadian Championship event will consist of a one-day single-elimination bracket competition held on August 21, 2016 at the Scotiabank Theatre, 259 Richmond Street West, Toronto, ON, M5V 3M6.
- Each Championship Qualifying Team must be willing and available to travel to Toronto, Ontario and participate in the Canadian Championship on the date and time as determined by the Administrator or the entire Team will forfeit their right to participate in said event. No player substitutions are permitted. If one or more Entrants on a Championship Qualifying Team are not available to participate at the Canadian Championship, the Team may still choose to play with only their available members. However, only those Entrants that play in the Canadian Championship will be eligible to receive a share of the prize, if applicable.
- The Canadian Championship will be in accordance with the instructions of the Administrator. Any disputes will be resolved by an independent judging organization, whose decision shall be final, conclusive and binding. The judges' decisions shall be made strictly in accordance with these Tournament Rules and any other rules and procedures put in place for the Canadian Championship.
  - Private Match Game Mode, Maps, and Settings for all tournament Games during the Canadian Championship:

    - Maps: Round 1: Game 1: Auction House; Game 2: Rooftops; Game 3 (if necessary): Scotland | Round 2: Game 1: Madagascar City; Game 2: Island; Game 3 (if necessary): Pirate Colony | Round 3: Game 1: Auction House; Game 2: Remnants; Game 3 (if necessary): River
    - Time Limit: 7:00 Minutes\*
    - Score Limit: 40
    - Wave Spawning: On
    - Respawn Time: 6 seconds
    - Downed State: On
    - Player Health: 100%
    - Boosters: On
- General tournament format and rules to ensure a fair competition will be provided to Championship Qualifiers at the Canadian Championship. Format and settings are subject to change at the discretion of the Administrator.
- All players may choose to bring their own PS4 controller. See Section 9 for additional details and restrictions regarding player equipment.
- Team seeding at the Canadian Championship will be based on the final rankings of the Online Canadian Championship Qualifying Tournament. The first place team will be the number one seed, the second place team will be the number two seed, etc.
- Quebec Entrants ONLY: The Canadian Championship event will be hosted, conducted and broadcast in English; however Entrants from Quebec will be permitted to play the Game in English or French. Unless the Entrant provides his/her language preference at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the start of the Canadian Championship, he/she will be required to play the Game in English.

## **5. REGIONAL QUALIFIERS LOCATIONS**

**NOTE:** Due to technical limitations, a select number of Regional Events will be held online rather than at a Cineplex theatre. The locations affected are noted below. The Regional Event for each affected location will be held online, at a Challenge link provided, as a single elimination bracket tournament on July 24<sup>th</sup>, with a start time of approximately

3:00pm. The exact start time of each affected Regional Event will be communicated to the Team Captain by email on or before July 20, 2016. Each Team Captain is responsible for communicating dates, times, and changes to their Team. With the exception of a change in venue for the affected Regional Events, all other Rules apply. The Team Captain for all affected Teams have been notified of the change in venue.

## 6. TOURNAMENT PRIZES

- **Travel Allowance:** Each Team Member of the eight (8) Championship Qualifying Teams that played during the Regional Events, will be provided with airfare (economy class and from the closest airport with direct flights to Toronto) and paid accommodation from August 20, 2016 through to August 21, 2016 at the Administrator's selection. If a Championship Qualifier lives close enough to the location of the Canadian Championship that airfare would not be reasonably required (as determined by Administrator) an alternate form of transportation may be provided. Hotel accommodation will be provided for all Championship Qualifiers. Championship Qualifying Teams must be available to travel to Toronto on the dates set out in the Tournament Rules or they will forfeit their right to participate in the Canadian Championship. Should a Championship Qualifying Team be unable to attend or does not qualify according to the Tournament Rules, Administrator, in its sole discretion, will select a suitable replacement from the remaining Regional Qualifying Teams, as described in Section 4 above. All decisions of the Administrator are final. The specific details of the trip to Toronto will be determined by Administrator at its sole discretion. No change in travelling arrangements can be made once the booking has been confirmed. The Releasees (as defined below) are not responsible if any scheduled event is delayed, postponed or cancelled for any reason. All other costs and expenses associated with the trip to Toronto and participation in the Canadian Championship (if any), including but not limited to, ground transportation between the Entrant's residence and the departure airport, and between the destination airport and hotel, additional accommodations if required, meals, gratuities, medical and travel insurance, items of a personal nature, applicable taxes (including airport taxes), personal charges at lodging, luggage fees, security fees or other expenses not specifically described herein are the sole responsibility of the Entrant. Entrants will be required to present ID at hotel check-in along with a valid credit card for potential incidentals or damages. In the event an Entrant is a Minor, his/her parent or legal guardian will be required to provide his/her ID and valid credit card to the hotel as per hotel policy.

- **Prizes:**

The following prizes will be awarded to the winning Teams of the Tournament:

- First place: \$50,000 CAD cash prize.
- Second place: \$10,000 CAD cash prize.
- Third place: \$5,000 CAD cash prize.
- Fourth place: \$1,000 CAD cash prize.
- Fifth through eighth place: \$500 CAD cash prize.

Cash prizes will be divided equally among the Team Members that participate in the Canadian Championships, regardless of whether other Team Members may have played during the other stages of the Tournament. By way of example for greater clarity only: *All 5 Team Members participate in the Regional Event and the Online Canadian Championship Qualifying Tournament. However, one Team Member is not able to travel to the Canadian Championships, leaving the Team with 4 remaining Team Members. If that Team wins first place, each Team Member that played in the Canadian Championships will receive \$12,500.00. The Team Member that was not able to participate, will not be awarded a share of the cash prize.*

Additional prizes to be awarded during the Tournament are set out below:

- Regional Qualifiers winner prize: Each Entrant on each winning Team will receive a Canadian Championships branded jersey (120 winner prizes, approximate retail value of each prize: \$150.00)



- Regional Qualifiers runner-up prize: Each Entrant on each runner-up Team will receive a \$25 PlayStation® Store Cash Card and two (2) Cineplex Admit One movie passes. (120 Runner-up prizes, approximate retail value of each prize: \$50.00)
- Regional Qualifiers third place prize: Each Entrant on each third place Team will receive one (1) Cineplex Admit One movie pass Regional Qualifiers(120 Admit One movies passes to be awarded, approximate retail value per prize: \$12.99)
- Online Canadian Championship Qualifying Tournament winner prize: Each Entrant qualifying for the Canadian Championship will receive paid accommodation at a downtown Toronto hotel for the purpose of participating in the final round of the Tournament (40 winner prizes, approximate retail value of each prize: \$214.00)
- Total approximate retail value of all cash and additional prizes \$103,677.60.

## **7. GENERAL PRIZE RESTRICTIONS**

- All prizes are non-transferable, and must be accepted as awarded, without substitutions. In the event that a prize, or any portion thereof, cannot be awarded as described in these Tournament Rules, Administrator reserves the right to substitute a prize of equivalent or greater retail value. Approximate Retail Value (“ARV”) is as of the date of printing of these Tournament Rules. The difference in value of prizes as stated herein and value at the time of prize notification, if any, will not be awarded. Select prizes will be distributed to the winner within one (1) month of verification by Administrator. Additional information regarding prize distribution may be provided to the winner at the time of notification. Unclaimed prizes will not be awarded.
- Winner shall be solely responsible for all provincial and/or local taxes, and the reporting consequences thereof, and for any other fees or costs associated with the applicable prize.

## **8. EQUIPMENT RESTRICTIONS**

- Player equipment is subject to approval by Administrator. Administrator will not permit the use of any equipment that may provide an unfair competitive advantage. Players may not use a controller that has been modified to allow for an alteration in an in-game character’s abilities or any other in-game mechanics. Players may not use a Keyboard/Mouse. Players may make cosmetic changes to their controller. Scuf Gaming controllers and Kontrol Freek accessories are permitted. A Tournament referee will pair each Player’s controller with the appropriate PS4 console via the on-site USB cable. A Player’s controller must pair with and remain connected to the PS4 console via the USB cable for the duration of their match. If a Player suspects that their opponent is using prohibited equipment that Player must inform a referee immediately. The Administrator reserves the right to refuse the use of any equipment it deems inappropriate for the Tournament and to disqualify any Entrant that violates this section of the Rules.

## **9. WINNER NOTIFICATION**

- Winners will be notified by email within twenty-four (24) hours of the conclusion of the Canadian Championship. Each Winner must send his/her full mailing address to the Administrator within five (5) days from the date of the email advising them that they are a winner, to successfully claim the prize or such prize may be deemed forfeited. Cash prizes will be awarded in the form of a cheque or money order made payable to the winner. In the event of any dispute concerning the operation of any element of the Tournament, the Finals or these Tournament Rules, the decision of the Administrator will be final. Any Entrant found to have violated these Tournament Rules, even after a prize has been awarded, will be disqualified and will be required to return the prize awarded, or cash equivalent in full within thirty (30) days following notice from Administrator that the Entrant has violated the Tournament Rules.

## **10. RELEASES**

By participating in the Tournament, each Entrant grants the Administrator with the right to use: (i) his/her name, email address, mailing address, telephone number and other personal information provided during his/her registration in the Tournament and any data collected while the Entrant is playing the Game, for the purpose of administering the Tournament, including but not limited to contacting and announcing the individuals who have qualified for the Regional Events and Canadian Championship; and (ii) his/her name, city and province of residence, video footage, images, voice recording, comments and opinions for entertainment, publicity and promotional purposes relating to the Tournament, in any and all media now known or hereafter devised, without further compensation unless prohibited by law. Entrants who have opted-in to receive marketing communications agree that the Releasees may use his/her Personal Information to contact him/her with marketing and other promotional messages related to products and services of the Releasees. In addition, by participating in the Tournament all Entrants acknowledge and agree that the Releasees may disclose their Personal Information to third-party agents and service providers in order to affect any of the activities listed above, in accordance with the Administrator's privacy policy located at <http://worldgaming.com/privacy/>.

## **12. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY**

- By entering this Tournament, each Entrant acknowledges compliance with, and agrees to be bound by, these Tournament Rules and consents to the use of his/her name, city of residence, and/or likeness in any publicity carried out by Releasees, and/or their advertising and promotional agencies and agents without further notice or compensation. Entrants release and hold harmless the Releasees from and against any and all manner of action, causes of action, suits, debts, covenants, contracts, claims and demands, including legal fees and expenses, whatsoever, including but not limited to, claims based on negligence, breach of contract and fundamental breach and liability for physical injury, death, or property damage which the Entrants or his/her administrators, heirs, successors or assigns might have or could have, by reason of or arising out of the Entrants participation in the Tournament, the Regional Events and/or the Canadian Championship and/or in connection with the acceptance, use and/or misuse by the Entrant of the prize.

- The Administrator reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify any individual who tampers with the entry process and/or void any games submitted fraudulently. Should multiple users of the same email account enter the Tournament and a dispute thereafter arise regarding the identity of the entrant, the authorized account holder of said e-mail account at the time of entry will be considered the entrant.
